



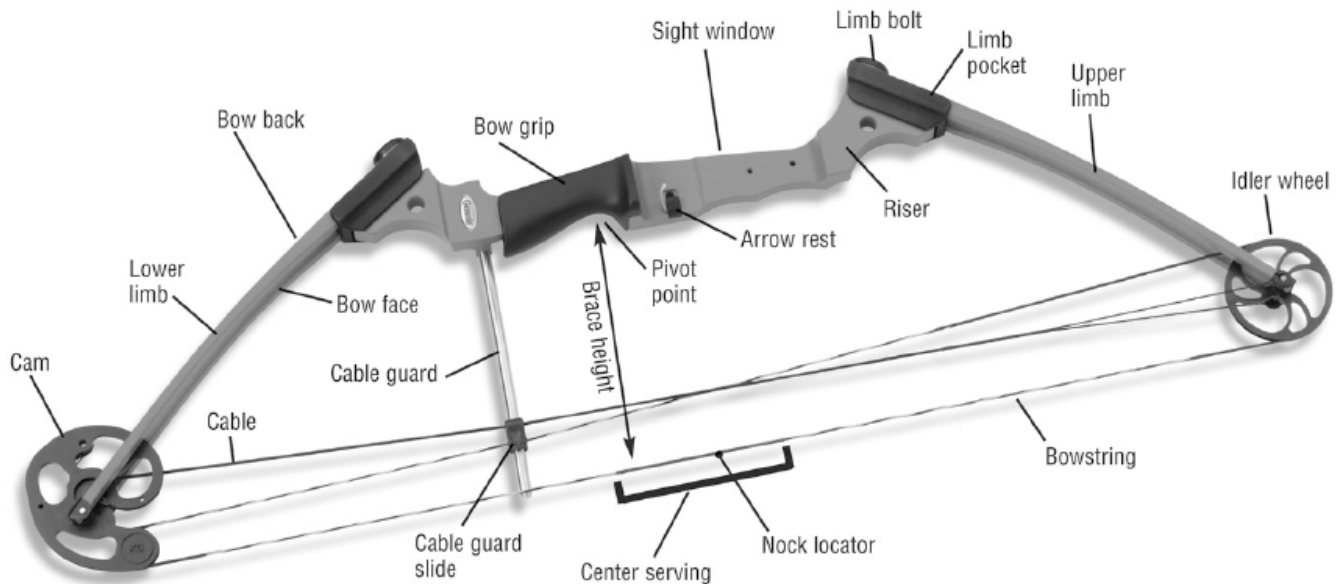

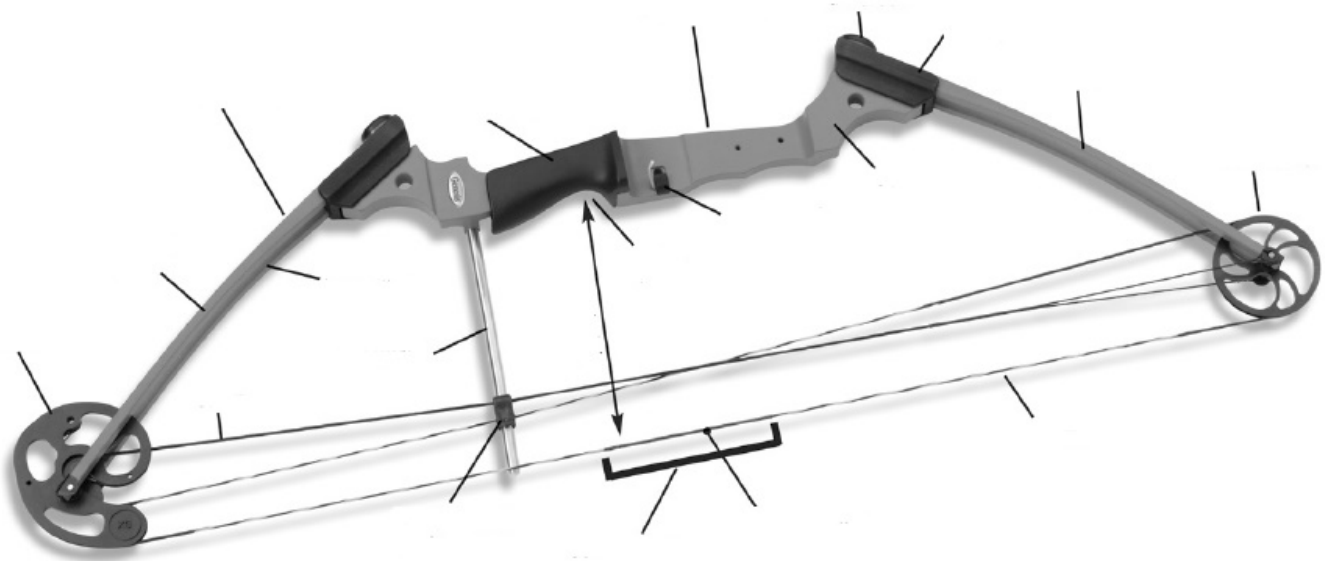


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On the compound bow below, write the parts of the bow next to each line.
